Range Rules

4.1 Introduction

The North Arm Shotgun Association Committee has established the following Range Rules for the use of NASAQ Facilities.

Posted Range Rules

Entry Requirements:

• All visitors must report to the Range Office and sign the range register before participating in any activities.

General Conduct:

- The Range Officer or committee may remove any individual for rule violations, inappropriate language, or behaviour.
- Follow all lawful instructions from the Range Officer or committee members while on the premises.
- Deliberately aiming or shooting at live animals or birds is strictly prohibited and must be reported to the Range Officer or Chief Range Officer.
- All extra targets must be paid for.
- For the comfort of other shooters, refrain from using mobile phones near shooting stands during competitions, unless approved by the Range Officer for special circumstances.
- Shooters must stay within the shooting stand area and should not move forward. Any issues must be brought to the Range Officer, not addressed personally.

Firearm Handling

- All firearms must be in excellent working order.
- Older firearms must be inspected and approved by the Range Officer before use.
- With Range Officer approval, shotgun patterning may be conducted on practice days.
- Firearms must always be unloaded with actions open, except when shooting.
- Firearms must be pointed safely forward while shooting.
- Only one shooter may fire at a target unless supervised by a Range Officer (except in "Flush Style Events," where team shooting is allowed).
- Firearms must be carried with actions open, uncocked, and unloaded. When using a gun slip, ensure the firearm's action is open when placing in or removing from the slip.
- Firearms may not be closed or shouldered outside of shooting stands.

- No actual or simulated shots are allowed outside shooting stands or while another squad member is firing.
- No shooter may move onto the shooting stand before it is vacated by the previous shooter or move forward of the stands without Range Officer knowledge.
- Shooters may load their firearm only after entering the shooting area, keeping the firearm open and pointed forward.
- Firearms may only be closed when it is the shooter's turn to shoot.
- Shooters must open their firearm and remove all cartridges before turning around or leaving the stand, regardless of whether the cartridges have been fired.
- During target presentation or breaks, firearms must remain open and unloaded.
- Club members may assist with gun mounting in a safe direction, only after confirming firearms are unloaded.

Specific Firearms Rules

- No more than two rounds loaded at a time unless supervised by a Range Officer.
- Maximum shotgun gauge allowed is 12g.
- Firearms must be at least 66 cm (26 inches) in length unless special approval is given.
- No firearms with magazine capacity over five rounds.
- Straps or slings, pistol grips, black powder firearms (without special approval), and Category D firearms (magazine capacity over 5) are not permitted.

Ammunition

- Maximum shot shell load is 28 grams, with shot size between 7-9 allowed.
- Black powder or tracer cartridges are forbidden unless supervised by the Range Officer.
- All purchasers of ammunition must provide a current firearms licence. For unlicensed shooters, refer to Section 4.11 (Ammunition Sales).

Juniors

- Juniors are under 18, or under 21 if a full-time student.
- Junior shooters aged 11–17 must be accompanied by a licensed adult.
- Juniors under 11 are not permitted to handle or use firearms.
- See Sections 6.4.4, 6.5.4, and 5.4.4 for further details on juniors and minors.

Squadding

• Squad assignments are at the discretion of the Range Officer or Committee.

Dress Code

- Eye and ear protection must be worn at all times on the range.
- Only covered footwear is permitted; sandals and thongs are not allowed.
- A shirt must be worn at all times; singlets are not allowed.
- Clothing with profane, suggestive, or improper words or designs is not permitted.
- Full camouflage attire is not allowed.

Alcohol Consumption

- No alcohol consumption is allowed while shooting.
- Alcohol may only be consumed in the designated "Authorised Area."

Ground Care

- The range is a flora and fauna reserve; shooting at animals is strictly forbidden.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times unless participating in pre-arranged dog training events.
- Do not tie up or leave dogs unattended in the clubhouse area.
- Dispose of all empty cartridges in the bins provided.
- All rubbish must be collected and disposed of properly.
